ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT: BRAHM SASNER

Brahm Sasner (Class of '22; piano & percussion, AHS Jazz & Wind Ensembles) is a 2nd year jazz piano performance major at the Manhattan School of Music (MSM). While a student at Acalanes. Brahm was a finalist for the national YoungArts competition, was selected as one of two pianists for the esteemed Vail Summer Jazz Workshop. and was offered numerous merit scholarships from institutions including MSM, UCLA, Berklee School of Music, The New School, and Cal State Fullerton, Brahm has continued to thrive since moving to Manhattan, becoming one of three finalists in the jazz category of the Rubato International Piano Competition. At MSM, Brahm belongs to two jazz combos, who have performed in eight US cities, including the Tri-C Jazz Festival in Cleveland and the House of Blues in Dallas. Brahm has also performed his original compositions in two feature films.

ALL STATE

Being selected for the All-State Ensembles is the highest honor any high school musician in California can receive. Regardless of the results, the "process" of preparing for the All-State band and orchestra auditions will make our students better musicians and performers.

Once students turn in the "Student Information Form" to me, they will get an email with instructions on how to upload recordings and pay the fee.

CONTRA COSTA COUNTY HONOR BANDS

The Contra Costa County Honor Band process is separate from All-State in that it is limited to high school band musicians from Contra County. The audition requirements are more simple: The All-State Scales and one prepared etude or solo that best demonstrates the student's ability.

Contra Costa Honor Band Application

\$30 due Monday, October 23rd with a check made payable to Acalanes Performing Arts Boosters "for Contra Costa County Honor Band"

Recording/Application due Tuesday, November 8th.

CODA DECEMBER HONOR ORCHESTRA (STRING AND BAND)

The CODA Honor Orchestra process is similar to All-State, but the audition excerpts and solos are a little easier - it is still very prestigious but not as difficult to get into the CODA Honor Orchestras. Wind players are also encouraged to apply as part of the SYMPHONY orchestra!
