EAGLE SCOUT PROJECT

For his Eagle Scout project, Naoto Watanabe recruited peer musicians from Acalanes (Scarlet, Rohan, Aya and Koto) and from other schools to develop and present music workshops for a non-profit organization called the Bay Area Music Project. Collaborating with the beneficiary officers, Naoto created an agenda featuring engaging activities, performances, instrument-specific section practices, and a Q&A. Through leadership, he assigned roles to peer musicians and conducted rehearsals to ensure the quality and interactive workshop for the children. In the workshop, the team players performed Avenger theme. Then they worked with each sections, practiced parts, and played Eine Kleine Nachtmusik all together at the end. ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT: STEVE TURRE

Steve Turre (AHS Class of '66) is a critically acclaimed trombonist (and seashell player!) who has been performing in the Saturday Night Live house band for nearly 40 years. He is a multiple awardwinning musician, having received the distinction of best trombonist by JazzTimes, Down Beat, and Jazziz, as well as a prolific recording artist with 20 albums (and over 200 with others) under his belt. Steve has had an exciting professional music career, including touring with Ray Charles in the 1970s and performing with jazz legends, Dizzy Gillespie, J.J. Johnson, Herbie Hancock, as well as Carlos Santana and Van Morrison, Growing up in Lafayette, Steve attended Lafayette Elementary School, where he picked up and fell in love with the trombone in the 4 th grade. In the 5th grade. Steve's parents brought him to a Duke Ellington concert featuring Ella Fitzgerald as a guest artist. Inspired by the performance and his parents' love for jazz, he joined the Stanley Middle School jazz band, where he decided he would become a professional jazz musician. At Acalanes, Steve was part of the AHS Concert and Stage Bands (the then-names of the wind ensemble and jazz/big band, directed by Mr. Elvo D'Amante, and later Mr. Leroy Roach) and was selected for the California All-State Honor Band. After graduating high school, Steve continued to study music at Sacramento State University and North Texas State University. In addition to his illustrious performing career, he taught jazz performance for 10 years at Julliard and for 18 years (and counting) at Manhattan School of Music, where he also holds a Master's degree. Steve describes his time at Acalanes as being formative to his musical development. He has fond memories of Mr. D'Amante, whom he describes as, "a wonderful teacher who inspired and challenged us with great material." On his periodic returns to the Bay Area, Steve has found ways to give back to the Lafayette community, including helping out with the Stanley jazz band. Steve believes in the importance of legacy, naming trombonist J.J. Johnson as the most influential musician in his life. Steve's two children have followed in his musical footsteps as professional musicians, a drummer son and jazz vocalist daughter, and his latest album, Generations, features three generations of musicians (including son Orion), with the intent to emphasize the importance of continuum in the jazz world.
